


BRIGS YOUTH SAIL TRAINING

HISTORY

Brigs began in 1962. Our founding tenents were the development of leadership, discipline, and citizenship in a maritime environment. The men and women who founded Brigs believed that exposure to the challenge of sea-going lifestyle could benefit young people. Our original vessel, Pathfinder, was commissioned in 1964 and Playfair joined the organization in 1973. Since our inception, "building character through adventure" has been the primary objective of Brigs.

By working together, sailing & managing our square-rigged ship, young people discover important life lessons and more importantly, they've discovered themselves. Our purpose is the provision of an environment, aboard ship and in the Winter Program that fosters and rewards self-confidence, teamwork, responsibility, custodianship and leadership in youth.



THE SHIP

The TS Playfair is the second training ship built for Brigs. Playfair's naming ceremony was conducted in Kingston on Wednesday, June 27th, 1973 during the Royal visit. Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and Prince Philip attended the ceremony, with Her Majesty making Playfair the first Canadian vessel ever to be named by a reigning monarch. It is a highly respected personal development award recognised by employers, colleges, and universities around the world.

Brigs is a Trained Activity Provider for the Award in Ontario. Our sail training voyages can qualify as either Adventurous Journeys or Gold Projects. Participants can join our scheduled summer courses, or our ship can be booked for an entire Award or school group to complete their Journey together. Participants can also achieve the Skills and Voluntary Service sections of the Award through participation in our shore-based Winter Program in Hamilton. Brigs is also an Award Centre so youth registering for our voyages can sign up to do the entire Award with us.

PATHFINDER ACCESS FUND

Brigs is committed to ensuring equitable access to our sail training programs. The Pathfinder Access Fund offsets the costs for youth trainees requiring financial assistance for their summer journey. We aim for 50% of our trainee berths onboard to be fully or partially funded.
